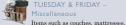
CAPS is a service provided by the Sanitation Department to city residents who wish to dispose of large bulky items such as couches, mattresses, furniture, brush and appliances, such as washers, dryers, refrigerators, freezers and water heaters. Pickup days are listed below.

MONDAY & THURSDAY - Brush

Brush that is picked up by CAPS is grinded and recycled into compost. Brush must be cut 6 feet in length or less and no larger than 24 inches in diameter. Please do not mix with trash, wood, paper, cans, bottles or wire.



furniture, wood and building materials. Do not mix items for pick up with household garbage, plastic bags, cardboard, paint, batteries or tires.

Dishwashers, washers and dryers. refrigerators, water heaters and metal items only. Remove old food from refrigerators and freezers.



Items scheduled for pickup must be placed curbside by 6 a.m. We offer special assistance to the disabled and elderly. We also need at least 20 feet of overhead clearance to safely operate equipment. Please do not place items under low power lines or tree limbs. Residents may have two collections per year at no cost, up to one ton, with a charge of \$20.00 for each collection thereafter. REFRIGERANT RECOVERY

Sanitation offers a removal service for refrigerators, air conditioners and other items containing compressors. Department technicians will remove any refrigerants from the compressors prior to final disposal to meet all federal, state and any other applicable laws. To schedule this service for an additional charge, call the CAPS line weekdays at 321-6921.

Household hazardous wastes are unused or leftover household products containing chemicals that are toxic. flammable, corrosive or reactive. It is harmful to discard them in the household trash, sinks, toilets or storm drains. Left stored improperly, these items can be a hazard to children, pets and the environment. For this reason, the city takes part in a collection event sponsored each fall by the Southwest Central Regional Solid Waste Management District. For information, call 321-6911.

FLECTRONIC WASTE RECYCLING

The Regional Recycling Center, located behind the Sanitation office, accepts electronic waste for recycling on weekdays from 7 a.m. until 3:30 p.m. Materials included in this program are monitors, CPU's (computers), keyboards, VCR's, DVD's, televisions (up to 19"), microwaves, electronic games and other small electronic items.

Newsprint, aluminum cans, plastics #1 and #2 (including retail bags), corrugated cardboard and phone books. may be deposited anytime in the marked bins near the Sanitation office at Valley/Runyon Street, White office paper may be placed in the bin within the gated lot next to the Sanitation office, 7 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. on weekdays.

Knock Out Litter is the slogan for the city's award-winning litter control program. developed to address a top priority identified



by the Hot Springs Board of Directors. The key components of this successful program include:

- · Full-time litter crew targeting major roadways throughout Hot Springs
- · Educational programs to build community awareness and elicit public support
- · Intensified enforcement of existing litter laws

You can help by using Sanitation Department services to dispose of litter; by participating in clean-ups; and by reporting those who litter.

To report litterers, call the city's 24-hour Action Line. 321-6808, with the following information: make, model, color and license plate; location; and type of littering. A courtesy letter will be sent by the Police Department, reminding the individual of litter laws and asking them to help keep Hot Springs beautiful.

AREA CLEAN-LIPS AND

Check the local news media for information on upcoming neighborhood clean-ups and larger events, such as the Sanitation Department's annual Spring Fling Citywide Clean-Up and the Trash Bash sponsored by the Hot Springs / Garland County Beautification Commission. DUMPSTER SERVICE

Sanitation offers a wide array of service levels to the business community. Business establishments are served by the commercial division, utilizing dumpsters which vary in capacity from 1 cubic vard to 8 cubic vards. The containers, which are provided by the city, can also be serviced from one to six times per week. Department staff works with the businesses to develop a service level that best meets their individual needs.

CONSTRUCTION ROLL OFF SERVICE

To service the development community, 30 cubic vard roll off containers can be obtained from Sanitation. The department offers the convenience of either scheduled or on-call service. Roll off containers are used for construction and demolition projects, as well as any major cleanup that requires more volume than the smaller containers can accommodate

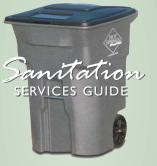

WHAT KIND OF SERVICE WILL I HAVE?

The city provides each household with a 96-gallon cart and weekly semi-automated curbside collection service. Qualifying residents may receive a smaller, 48-gallon cart. The wheeled carts are attractive, weather resistant and easy to maneuver, with tight-fitting lids that reduce problems with animals and other pests.

WHEN DO I PLACE MY CART FOR PICKU

Carts must be set out for collection by 6 a.m. on collection day, or after 6 p.m. the previous night. After collection, carts must be removed from the curb before 6 p.m. and stored in a convenient place near your house.

WHAT DO I PUT IN THE GARBAGE CART?

Only typical household garbage goes into the cart. The garbage should be placed in plastic bags and sealed, to prevent litter and to help keep your cart clean.

- Do not put yard waste such as grass clippings, leaves, or tree trimmings in the cart. Those items will be picked up by a different crew on the leaf and mulch collection days.
- Do not put lumber, shingles, rocks, dirt, and and other household building debris in the cart. These items can be scheduled for collection by calling the CAPS division at 321,6921
- Do not place hot coals from your barbecue grill in the garbage cart. It's a tough cart, but it's no barbecue grill and it could melt or catch on fire.

WHAT ABOUT GARBAGE THAT WON'T FIT

Occasionally, you may have more household garbage than will fit in your cart. If you have extra garbage, seal

it in a plastic bag and place it next to your cart (no boxes, please). Never put more in your cart than it can hold with the lid closed. The collection crew will not dump over-filled carts. The closed lid helps control litter and odors and prevents spillage when the vehicle dumps the cart. If you routinely have more garbage than will fit in your cart, an additional cart must be requested by calling 321-6911.

MY CART IS LOST OR STOLEN?

The cart is city property.

and we expect residents to take reasonable care. It must not be painted, mutilated, altered or modified in any way. If the collection truck damages or destroys your cart, it will be replaced at no cost to you. If the responsibility for the damage or loss

of a cart cannot be determined, the city will replace it at public expense. If the damage is caused by negligence of the resident, the container will be replaced at a \$50.00 charge. Lost or stolen carts will be replaced once at no charge. Any subsequent losses will be the responsibility of the resident. Lost or stolen carts should be reported to the Police and Sanitation departments.

WHEN I MOVE? The cart is issued to a specific street

The cart is issued to a specini street address, and must not be moved from that address. If you are moving somewhere else where the city collects garbage, you will get a cart assigned to that location.

WHY ARE RESIDENTIAL WASTE COLLECTION AND RECYCLING RELATED?

By recycling and re-using, you can significantly reduce the volume that goes in your cart each week for residential waste collection. Recycling also reduces the amount of waste that is sent to the landfill, which in turn reduces costs and helps keep rates down. Finally, recycling is good for the environment, reducing the amount of energy and raw materials needed to make new items.

SPRING FLING

Carts should be positioned at the curb, approximately three feet

from the street. The handle of the cart should face your house

The CAPS section of this brochure describes the city's large or bulky item pickup service, which is available by appointment. In addition to CAPS, the city holds a "Spring Fling" citywide clean-up each spring. During the event, roll off containers are placed in all six city districts for citizen convenience. The Spring Fling is a way for residents and businesses to clean out their garages, yards, vacant lots, neighborhoods and storefronts. The event provides residents with an additional free disposal service each vear in addition to their allotted CAPS pickup.

EWSPRINT

Newsprint only; if it comes in the newspaper, it can be recycled. Please do not tie or bag newsprint. It must be dry, clean and unsoiled (free of wax, plastics and other contaminants). It should not have been exposed to the sun for long periods of time. No magazines, catalogs or junk mail. Place newsprint in provided container with lid curbside before 6 a.m.



ALUMINUM

Rinse beverage cans. No tin cans, foil, siding or pie pans. Crush the cans in order to save space. Hint: If in doubt, use a refrigerator magnet. If the magnet sticks, it is not aluminum.



The city provides recycling containers at no charge. To receive a recycling container or collection schedule, call 321-6911.

ROWN PAPER BAGS

Brown paper grocery bags only. No white or colored bags.

Put all bags inside another bag and place with other recyclables.

Do not place for collection if there is threat of rain.



LEAF AND MULCH PICKUI

Leaves must be in plastic bags and placed curbside by 6 a.m., with a 50-bag limit per collection. Small shrub trimmings no longer than three feet in length or six inches in diameter must be bundled so one person can handle them. Please place bags and bundles curbside no more than 12 hours prior to collection. Pickup days will be the same as recyclables, every two weeks. If the leaf and mulch is contaminated with other items such as household waste rocks or dirt. the material will not be collected.



COPPLICATED CAPDROAPE

Corrugated cardboard (a wavy layer between two flat layers) only. No pasteboard, such as cereal and shoe boxes. Flatten boxes and stack together. Labels, tape and staples do not have to be removed. Place flat on ground with recycle bucket on top. Do not place for collection if there is threat of rain.
