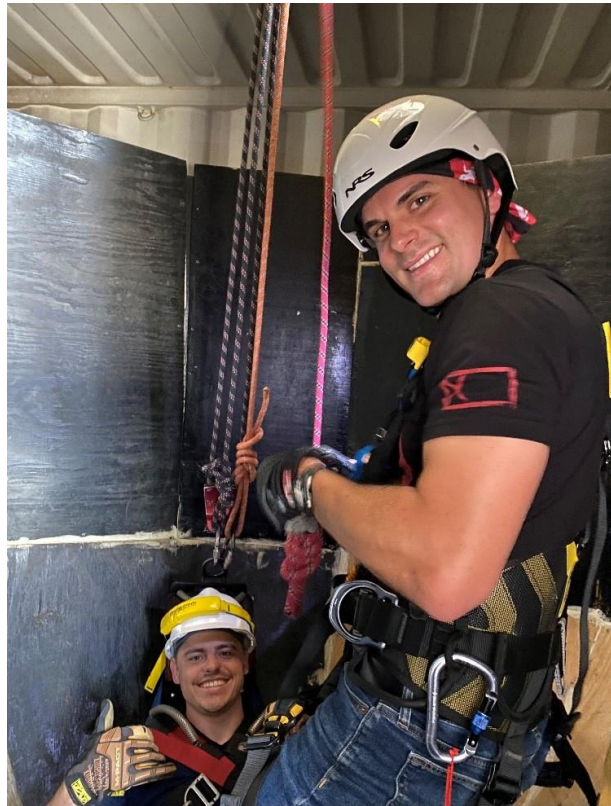

FROM FIRE CHIEF DAVIS

June was a typical early summer month for the Fire Department. With the onset of hot weather, we began staffing a Wellness Officer on each shift who monitors the firefighters' physical condition during emergency operations. The Wellness Officer is also responsible for rest and rehab operations on emergency scenes and the firefighters return to duty after the completion of each recovery cycle.

With the retirement of LifeNet CEO Dave Baumgartner, a slate of candidates was selected by the LifeNet Board of Directors to establish a path of succession to fill the leadership void created by his retirement. I had the opportunity to meet with the finalists prior to the final hiring decision. Ultimately Dave Snaveley was chosen as the new LifeNet CEO. Dave was at one time the Garland County Director of LifeNet. We wish him well in his new leadership position.

June 8th through June 11th we hosted the Arkansas Fire Conference at the Hot Springs Convention Center. The conference brought firefighters and fire chiefs from across the State of Arkansas to learn, network and socialize here in our City. I also attended the Garland County Emergency Services meeting and met with area fire chiefs and other emergency responders.

Andy Davis, John Pricop, Kyle Rosburg, and Nate Hall coordinated rope rescue training for our firefighters during the month. Andy authored a grant application that was funded by the US Fire Administration that paid for advanced rope rescue training for several of our trainers who in turn conducted the instruction for the fire department.

TRAINING OFFICER, TY FARRIS

- Firefighters and newer Drivers practiced their pump operations skills in June. Participants in the training had to provide water to various hose lines and connect to a fire hydrant while providing appropriate pressures to the hose lines.
- Lieutenant Andrew Davis, Drivers John Pricop and Nate Hall and Firefighter Kyle Rosburg provided rope training to each shift following their training at Roco Rescue in Baton Rouge in April. The training focused on a review of rescue rope and equipment, rescue knots, anchoring and rigging, lowering systems and belay systems (safety). More training will be scheduled in the future as newer rope rescue equipment is obtained.
- Dive team members conducted a dive drill at Lake Hamilton to assist with equipment familiarization and search techniques.
- Training Officer Farris conducted seven CPR classes for the Hot Springs Police Department. Over 100 Police personnel were recertified in CPR and the use of AEDs.

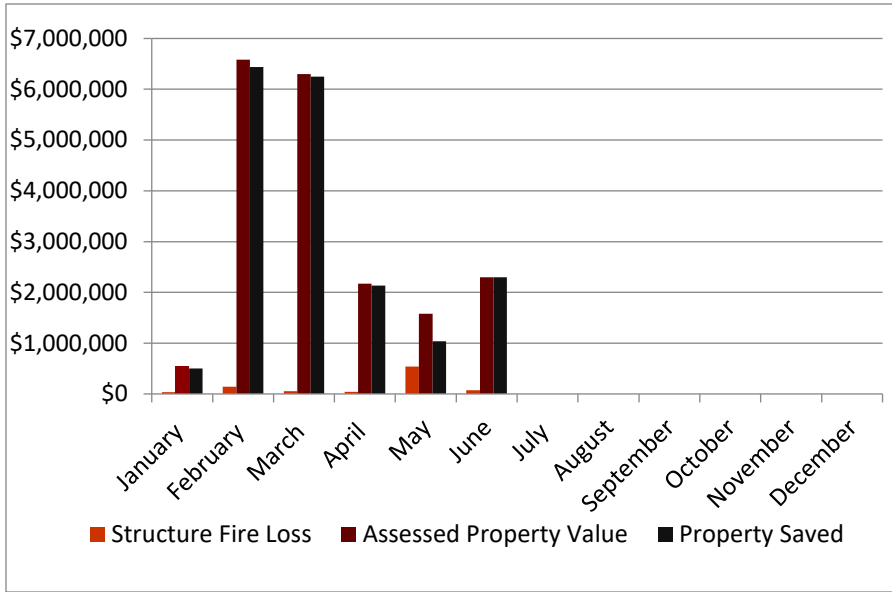

Structure fire loss through June 2022: \$884,037.

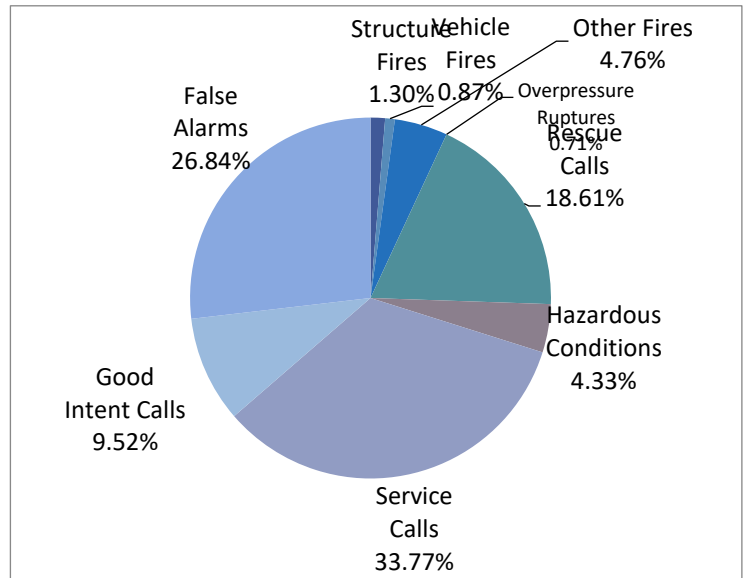
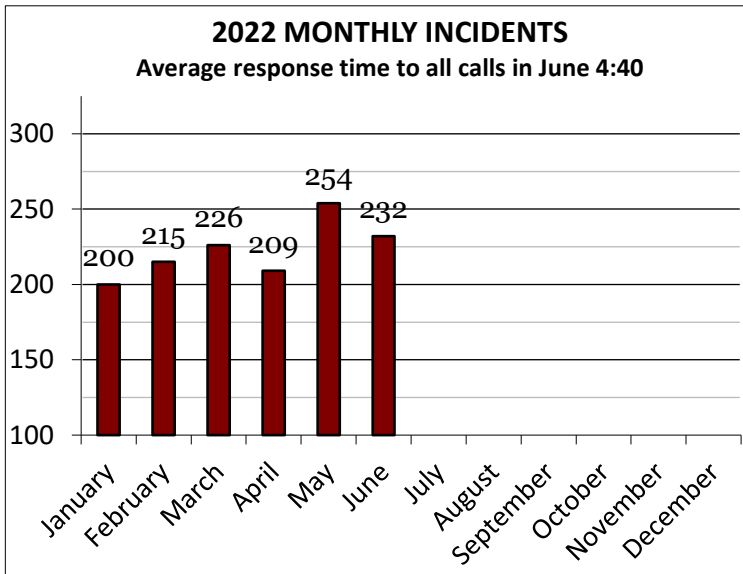
Total Property Saved through June 2022: \$16,352,881.

Average response time to structure fires in June 2022: 2:31

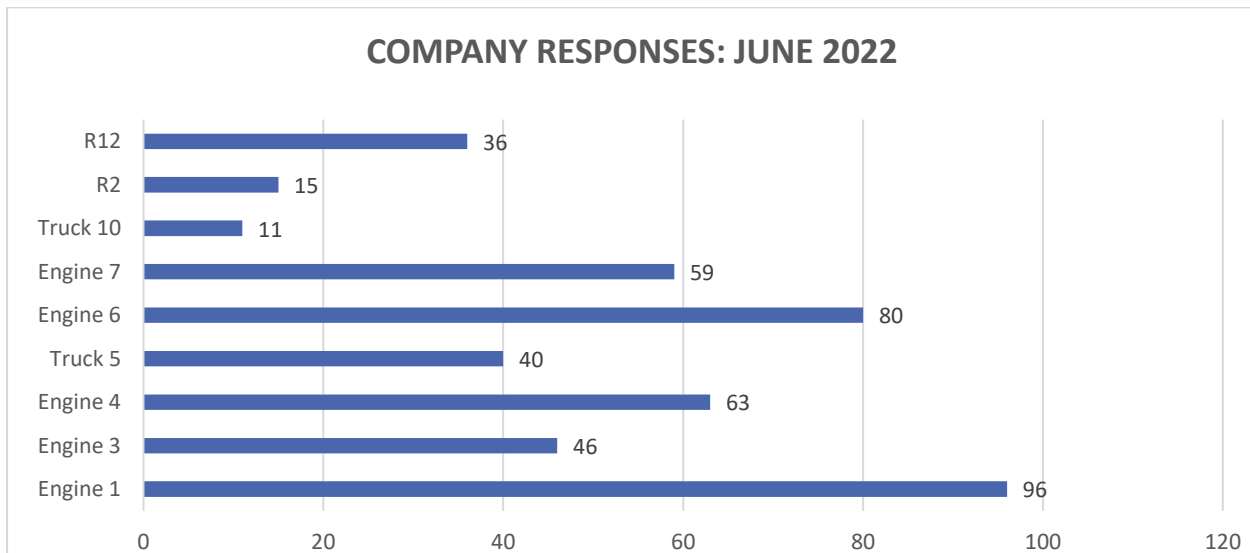


MONTHLY INCIDENT COUNTS
